School Meals Arrears and Debt Recovery Policy

This policy has been written to help the school to adopt a consistent approach to debt. It provides clarity and consistency in managing debt and will also help parents clearly understand what is expected of them.

The Free School Meals system is there for parents who cannot afford school meals and applying for Free School Meals is straight forward. Parents can apply either online or over the telephone, assuming eligibility is authorised the child can take a free school meal the following school day. The school administration team will be able to support a parent if they have questions about the application process.

<u>Decoy School will take all practicable measures to collect debt as part of its management of public funds.</u>
Debtors will be actively pursued for the collection of monies owed.

- In general, payment for all goods and services will be collected in advance or at point of sale.
- We appreciate that there may be an exceptional circumstance when your child needs to have a school lunch prior to payment in these cases the school expects payment for this on the next working day. The preferred payment method is via the online payment system, but we can accept cash or cheque (made payable to DCC) in advance or on the day of purchase.
- Should parents/carers allow their dinner money to go into arrears, then a letter will be sent at the end of that week asking for payment before any further school meals are taken.
- Should this debt not be cleared in a timely fashion (by the end of the following week) then a further letter will be sent out.
- Should a debt reach in excess of £10 per child, a further letter is sent stating a final payment due date and stating that no further meals will be provided until the debt is cleared or a payment plan has been put in place. This will be followed up by a direct telephone conversation with the School Business Manager or Headteacher.
- Should a pupil in these circumstances request a meal, parents/carers will be contacted and asked to provide a meal for their child.
- On-going debts may be referred to Devon County Council who will follow up with necessary action to recover the arrears.
- All children in Foundation Stage, Year 1 and Year 2 are automatically entitled to receive free school meals
 under the government's Universal Free School Meal offer. However, all parents/carers who are in receipt
 of certain benefits are encouraged to apply for Free School Meals when they enrol their child in school or
 after a change of circumstances, as this can help attract additional funding, Pupil Premium, into school to

support learning and will mean your child qualifies for free school meals through into Year 3 and beyond. You can ask for a form at the school office or apply at:
